Now you See Me...Now You Don't!

From the time I first I laid eyes on a Gold Wing decked out with the 'Pearl Hot Rod Yellow' Honda paint I wanted one! That bright color looked so great with the chrome gleaning and outlining it so perfectly. It was like peas and carrots...burger and fries! That is why when last Fall a beautiful, low mileage 2001 Gold Wing came into my radar for a great price I fell in love with it immediately, bought it and named her Elly May after the blond-haired character on the Beverly Hillbillies (LOL). However, beyond the beauty I saw in that beautiful yellow color there was another more practical reason I liked the color and that was because I believed it would make me more visible on the road. I had always wondered if I was right in that assumption so I decided to find out.

We have all seen our share of motorcycles that are black. My first Honda was a black 1974 Honda 750

Four with a Vetter fairing and saddle bags (see picture). We have also seen our share of riders decked out in all black leather and why not? It looks so stinking cool! However, although black does indeed look so cool the distinct downside is visibility.

In a study about the relationship between vehicle accidents and color a very distinct correlation was found between the color of a vehicle crash risk. This study was done for automobiles but there is no reason to think it doesn't also apply to motorcycle colors as well. The study showed that the color **white** was the safest color with the colors **yellow**, **beige** and **cream** very closely behind. The rest of the study results compared the crash risk percentage of other colors as they related to the color **white**. These were the results:



Green - 4% higher crash risk

Blue & Red - 7% higher crash risk

Silver – 10% higher crash risk

Grey – 11% higher crash risk

Black – 12% higher crash risk (the highest)

Time of day and vehicle color also has an impact on crash risk. In a study that focused on dusk and dawn accidents, it was found that black vehicles had a 47% higher crash risk when compared to white. Grey had a 25% higher crash risk during those same times. This was attributed primarily to low visibility of these colors due to how they blended into the surroundings.

It also goes without saying that the color of the riding apparel also plays a significant factor in visibility. One study showed that motorcyclists were 37% less likely to be involved in an accident when wearing high-visibility or fluorescent clothing. White helmets were recommended over darker colors.

In the final analysis we all know the greater accident risk we run by riding a motorcycle. However, in addition to good defensive riding habits, riding as a group, lighting up our bikes, etc., brighter colored paint and high visibility clothing can also reduce the risk of an accident.

Oh, by the way. Did I tell you I love Elly May?

Have you checked your bike before you ride? Riding season is upon us and before you ride you need to check your bike over for safe and enjoyable rides. Things to keep in mind are checking fluids and topping off, looking at tire conditions and pressure, inspecting lights and looking at controls and switches, and look at your accessories to make sure they are working properly and secure to the bike.

It appears we have some log rides on the schedule this year and it is important to make it home safely.


because all the food was delicious. We continued our journey and bunked down for the night at the Drury Inn Suites, Meridian, Mississippi.





Bacon Biscuits with Strawberry Butter

Ingredients

Biscuits

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 tablespoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 8 tablespoons shortening
- ²/₃ cup buttermilk
- ½ cup crispy bacon bits
- 1 tablespoon butter, melted

Makes: 8 biscuits **Prep Time:** 15 minutes Cook Time: 20 minutes Total Time: 35 minutes







Strawberry Butter:



½ cup strawberry preserves

½ cup butter, softened

¼ cup strawberries, chopped

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 425 degrees.
- 2. In a large mixing bowl, combine the flour, baking powder and salt. Cut in the shortening until the mixture forms coarse crumbles resembling small peas. Stir in buttermilk and bacon until just combined.
- 3. Roll out dough and cut into 8 biscuits (about 2½ inches each). Brush tops with melted butter and bake for 10 to 12 minutes until golden.
- 4. While biscuits bake, prepare the strawberry butter. In a medium bowl, combine strawberry preserves, butter and strawberries. Stir until creamy and combined.
- 5. Serve biscuits warm with strawberry butter on top.
