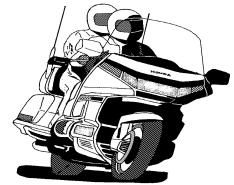

Favorite Recipes

White Chocolate Bread Pudding

From Carolyn Jarrell, Chapter TN-C

- 4 cups heavy whipping cream
- 1 lb. Pepperidge Farm Hot and Crusty French bread
- 3 eggs lightly beaten
- ½ cup sugar
- 2 Tbsp vanilla
- 1 12-oz pkg white chocolate chips

Pour cream over French bread that has been torn into 1" pieces. Let it soak for 30 minutes or so. Stir eggs, sugar and vanilla into bread mixture. Stir in white chocolate chips. Pour into a greased 9 x 13 glass pan and bake at 350° for 45 minutes to 1 hour. It should be a little gooey. Serve with sauce.

- Sauce
- 1 12-oz pkg white chocolate chips
 - 1 cup heavy whipping cream

Place white chocolate and cream in a glass jar or container and microwave for 2 minutes. Stir until smooth. Heat before serving.

Stereo - GPS, with its music, instructions, Bluetooth cell phone and XM radio
Stereo - iPod
Mono - Ham Radio
Mono - Radar Detector.

The challenge has always been how to get all this audio to play nice together. In the past three years I've tried at least 5 different ways to interconnect these devices. The J&M cell phone interface worked (kind of) and so did switches and a few other things. But if you looked under my left fairing pocket you would not believe the nightmare of wires and intermittent connections.

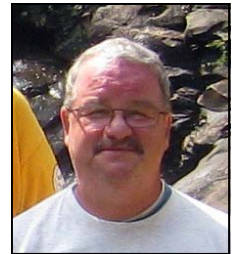
About a month ago a Mixit-It2 add caught my eye. Basically it's an amplified mixer that combines audio from four different sources (2 stereo and 2 mono) and makes them play nice. Just what I was looking for so I ordered one at \$160.00. While not cheap, it's a lot cheaper than

some of the other things on the market.

When the box came and I opened it the device looked just like the picture and measures about 5"x3"x1" and fits nicely in my RIGHT fairing pocket. My only concern was that it is in a plastic enclosure not metal. But that doesn't seem to be a problem. The Mixit is powered from either a 9V battery, or you can connect directly to +12v and the unit turns on/off with the ignition. While not waterproof, the manufacture said it is water resistant.

The unit works PERFECTLY and operation is simple; you control the volume from each gadget separately with its volume control. The Mixit has its own output volume and once set there is no need to touch it again. You connect two stereo inputs and two mono inputs. With one of the mono inputs being a priority input. So say when your radar detector goes off the other three mute much like the standard stereo on your Gold Wing.

Are You Ready???

Spring has sprung, so get out there and get that Goldwing ready for the road. You need to make sure you're all ready to go when the opportunity presents itself.

- Make sure you have fresh oil and filter—most important.
- Review your records and see how old your coolant is. If the coolant is more than 2 or 3 years old you might think about having it changed. Your Honda dealer has it already pre-mixed in quart plastic bottles—highly recommended.
- The same goes with the DOT 3 or 4 brake and clutch oil—it also needs to be changed every few years.
- If you have a GL1500 you might want to change your fuel filter.
- Batteries are pretty much maintenance-free these

days but don't forget to check it out to make sure all the connections are tight and if not a maintenance-free one, make sure to check the electrolyte level; a trickle charge is always good. Don't get caught with a low battery when you're ready to go!

- Check your tires and brakes—old rubber can be very bad if you are not one to put many miles on your bike. The rubber might have lots of tread but the rubber may have cracks (dry rot).
- The valve stems are the same situation; don't get caught out on the road with a flat caused by an old cracked valve stem you forgot to change after it got old. The tire may hold air good until the stem gets moved when you air the tire up in the spring after it loses air during the off season.
- Review your operators handbook for the maintenance schedule for your particular model.

Team Riding Techniques and Procedures (Taken from GWRRA's TEAM RIDING MANUAL)

Large groups of motorcycles (more than 5-7) may have a negative impact on safe traffic flow and are more difficult to coordinate. Consequently, it has been found that it is safer to break the large group into more manageable teams. The optimal team size is considered to be 5 bikes, but should never be more than 7. Each team rides apart from the other teams during the ride. It is suggested that a minimum distance of 1/4 mile (15 second separation at 60 mph) be maintained between the teams on expressways or highways. On two-lane roads this distance may need to be increased. This allows better assimilation of the teams into the flow of traffic. Have you ever tried to pass a group of 25 motorcycles? A team consisting of 5 motorcycles is more easily dealt with by the other motorists we share the road with, is easier to maintain visual control over, and is better for coordinating the ride.

Team Management

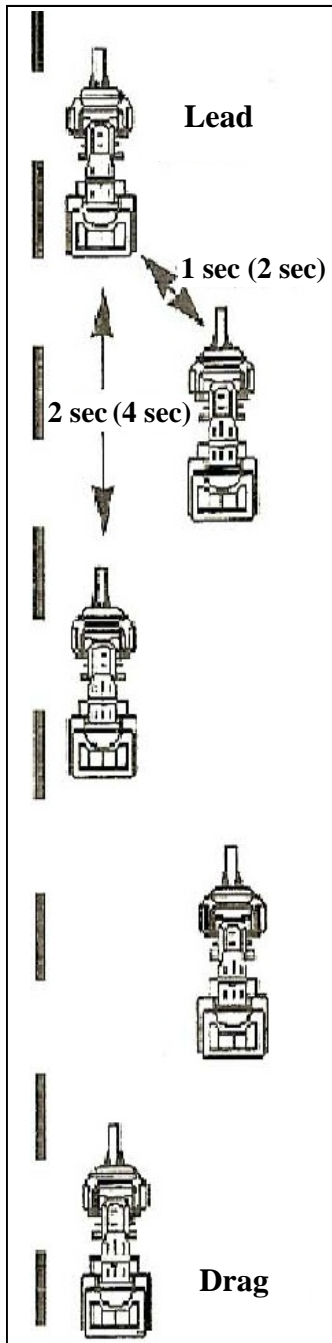
Each team should have a Drag Rider and a Lead Rider. The Lead rides at the front of the formation (Bike #1) while the Drag rides at the back (Bike #5). These two positions should be equipped with functioning C.B. radios. Their responsibility is to communicate, coordinate, and maneuver the team in formation safely through traffic as a unit. The Drag and the Lead have joint responsibility for the safety of the team and safe conduct of the ride.

A Good Team Member . . .

1. Assumes a responsibility to ride with and work with the other team

members for the safety and protection of the whole team while on the road, and especially while in traffic.

2. Maintains steady speed and spacing. Yo-Yoing or straggling behind disrupts the rhythm and efforts of the other team members, and reduces the benefits of riding as a team.
3. Stays alert and announces to the other team members any obstacle, conditions or potential situation which could become hazardous to the team or a team member.
4. Will be aware of the other team members and maintain the formation (staggered) and a safe riding distance (spacing) between team members. Spacing will be determined by the road, weather conditions, and visibility.



Spacing Between Motorcycles

1. Pace yourself: Maintain a 1-second stagger and a 2-second following distance behind the bike directly in front of you. (However, during darkness or inclement weather, a 2-second stagger and a 4-second following distance should be maintained to provide an extra margin of safety.)
2. "Holes" left in the formation (large spacing gaps between team members) invites aggressive motorists driving at faster speeds to cut into the formation, which may result in tail gating our teammate ahead of us. This creates a very dangerous situation. Each team member must protect the other by maintaining the appropriate spacing.

WHERE WOULD YOU LIKE TO RIDE?

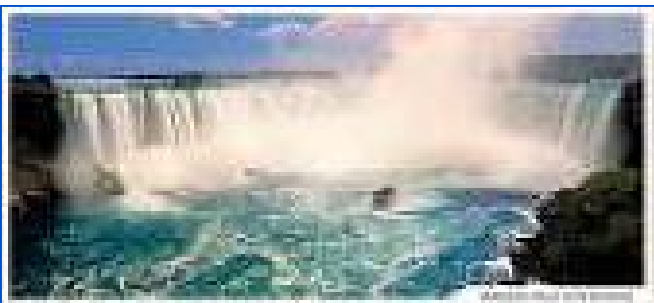


GWRRA's Officer Certification Program

Chapter Educator Section

GWRRA Rider Education Levels Program

Level I of the Rider Education Program is also referred to as **Safe Miles**. It represents the commitment of the Rider and/or the Co-Rider to practice safe motorcycle operation whenever they operate their motorcycle.

Requirement: Verbal commitment to ride safely at all times.
No cost to sign up. Patches available at \$6.00 per participant
Receive: "Safe Miles" patch, Rider (or Co-rider) Rocker, and mileage pin

Level II of the REP is also referred to as **Tour Rider**. It represents the commitment of the Rider and/or Co-Rider to be safer motorcycle riders by taking approved motorcycle riding courses at regular intervals

Requirement: Rider - a Certified Rider Course with 5,000 safe miles. Co-Rider - certified Co-rider Seminar or 2-up Rider Course No cost to sign up.
Patches available at \$5.00 per participant Receive: "Red Triangle" patch for either Rider or Co-rider signifying Level II participant.

Level III of the REP is also referred to as **Certified Tour Rider/Co-Rider**. It represents the commitment of the Rider and/or Co-Rider to be prepared in the event of an accident to give aid and possibly save lives. This is done by being knowledgeable in First Aid or CPR and carrying a first aid kit on their motorcycle at all times

Requirement: Current in Level II and have taken either First Aid or CPR training
No cost to sign up. Patches available at \$4.00 per participant
Receive: "Certified Tour Rider" or "Certified Co-Rider" patch

Level IV is the most prestigious of the REP levels and is referred to as **Master Tour Rider/Co-Rider**. It represents the highest commitment of the Rider and/or Co-Rider to safe riding and preparedness. This commitment is shown by a demonstrated history of safe miles and current certification in **both** First Aid **and** CPR.. These Master Tour Riders/Co-Riders are the finest example to everyone of the highest commitment to safe motorcycle operation and preparedness.

Requirement: Current in Level III for one year and have taken both First Aid and CPR training. Have 25,000 Safe Miles and must be committed to riding with "Proper Riding Gear" at all times. Cost: \$35.00 for each participant (Black and Gold patch is available for another \$8.00) Receive: "Special Triangular" patch with dark blue border and your individual Master number embroidered on it.
