





Four Types of Riding Distractions

Riding season is upon us and I for one cannot wait for our first group ride. As part of making sure we are all riding safely I wanted to address the most common types of riding distractions and talk about how we can all make sure we don't fall victim to these distractions while we ride.

The first common type of distraction is visual. This is where we find ourselves looking at something other than the road in front of us. Target fixation can be a real problem when riding. Sometimes it is a driver who just cut us off and who we now are fixated on yet we are forgetting to look at the other cars around us. Our eyes must be constantly moving and watching the road in front of us while being aware of what is beside and behind us. Another visual distraction can be our GPS or our smartphones. Always make it a habit to never look at these for more than a second or two at a time and NEVER try to operate one unless you have come to a complete stop. Even when you are stopped at a red light you must be vigilant as to what is happening around you. The rule of thumb is to not mess with these things unless you are pulled off the road and at a complete stop.

Auditory distractions are also a real issue. Many of us have our favorite music we like to pipe into our helmets but this can be a big distraction if it causes us to not hear things around us or if a certain song causes us to ride more aggressively. Sometimes it is another loud vehicle which we hear and look at. That can take our eyes off the road in front of us.


Manual distractions are one of the most common causes of accidents. Most of us have Goldwings and they have all kinds of buttons and switches. When we ride, we must be very familiar with all of the basic controls on our motorcycles so we don't have to look down to find them. Obviously controls like clutch, brakes, shift lever, throttle, etc. have to be second nature but we must also know, without looking, where our other key controls are such as turn signals, high/low beam, emergency cut off switch, horn, etc. If you have to look down to find these while you are riding your eyes are no longer on the road and that results in distracted riding.

The last distraction is cognitive. You have to ride in the moment and there are times when our minds are not focused on the road in front of us but about something else. Maybe we are thinking about the argument we just had with our spouse (not me of course as Hedie and I never argue...lol) or maybe you are thinking about how bad your 401K is doing or the movie you just saw. Obviously, our minds will naturally wander however we must always be riding in the moment and not become too fixated on other thoughts.

In summary, let's focus on having a safe riding season and staying distraction free as we ride. Can't wait to see you all at our first group ride!

For several years know I have been writing this article and as riding season is up on us it is very important to look at your motorcycle as many things can happen to it while setting over the winter.

As I have been getting peoples bikes and trikes ready for riding season this year we have ran across several odd things like light bulbs burned out to spongy brakes or no brakes or needing oil changes or flat tires or installing the latest accessories and even a wiring harness chewed into by a rodent but for some reason this winter seems to have been hard on motorcycles. Know with this said I would like to remind people to take a couple of hours out of your day and look over your motorcycles to make for a better riding experience this year. Remember our first official ride of the year is in 2 weeks. For motorcycle riders, warmer days mean it's time to ride. If your motorcycle has been cooped up inside a garage all winter, you know that there are a few things to do in order to get it ready for the road. Having a motorcycle maintenance checklist can help ensure that you don't skip any steps.

Do motorcycles need a lot of maintenance?

The motorcycle driving experience is unique, but what about the maintenance? If you've been on the fence about getting a motorcycle, then you'll be happy with the answer. Motorcycle preventative maintenance is typically much simpler than that of cars. Motorcycles are smaller, have fewer parts that are easier to access, and are resultingly much easier to maintain. One point of maintenance many motorcycles require that cars do not is the chain. And the type of upkeep tasks they share are typically easier on motorcycles.¹

Motorcycle maintenance checklist

Before you take your motorcycle out for that first ride of the season, use this motorcycle maintenance checklist to help keep yourself (and those around you) safe on the road.

Start with fresh fuel¹

If you didn't drive your motorcycle all winter, the first thing to do is change the fuel. Gasoline gets stale when it sits in the tank too long. Use a siphon pump to get rid of any old gas, and then fill the tank with fresh fuel.

Change the oil

Just as you need clean fuel, you also need to change the oil and replace the oil filter before you take your bike out for your first ride. Neglecting this step can affect the performance and longevity of your motorcycle.

Check the battery life

Some riders disconnect their motorcycle batteries for the winter and recharge them every month or two. Once you reconnect the battery, you're probably ready to roll. However, if it's been sitting all winter long, you might have a dead battery on your hands. If it's a fairly new battery, charging it up is fine. If it's three or four years old, you may find it doesn't keep a charge, or you might have a hard time charging it. In that case, you're probably better off purchasing a new battery and playing it safe.

Check your tires

Tires are some of the most important parts of any vehicle, so they deserve your time and attention. Check their air pressure to make sure it's at a safe level for riding. You'll also want to check your tread to determine if it's still got enough depth to offer you sufficient traction. If your air pressure and tread are all set, then just look for any cracks or rot in the sidewall of the tires before moving on.

Inspect your chain

Your bike's chain is one of its most critical components, but constant exposure to the elements can cause it to deteriorate or become loose. Check it to ensure it's still tight and well-lubricated. You may need to clean the chain and reapply lubricant.

Get plenty of fluids

Oil and gas aren't the only fluids your motorcycle depends on. Brake fluid and coolant are important for motorbike maintenance, but they can sometimes leak if your bike is left standing for a long period of time. Double-check your levels and refill or top them off. Or, flush out the old fluids and replace them with fresh fluids.

Don't forget your cables

Oil and grease in your cable housing can dry up over time, and that can affect the performance of your clutch and throttle. Inspect your clutch, brakes, throttle, choke, and any other cables to ensure they're still responsive and not frayed.

Make your bike shine

As a final step, make sure you give your motorcycle a thorough cleaning. Not only does it protect your paint and make your bike look fantastic, but cleaning your bike frequently keeps it in better working condition²

When should I service my motorcycle?

You want your bike to be ride-ready at all times! So how often should you service your motorcycle? You'll need to change your oil and check your chain on a regular basis - every 6 months or 4,000 miles.

Your tire pressure should be checked more frequently, at least once a month. In the longer-term, you'll need to tune your carburetor and flush your cooling system (if you have a water-cooled engine) every two years or so. You can do much of this maintenance yourself for lower cost, however some may prefer to let an expert handle it. A professional should also be consulted if more severe issues like engine trouble emerge.³

Motorcycle maintenance is an important part of staying safe on the road

Following this motorcycle safety inspection checklist helps ensure your bike is ready to take on the road. Without a helpful service checklist to refer to, properly maintaining your bike over time can become more difficult. More so, not having a well-cared for motorcycle on the road becomes less safe for you and those around you.



Snap Pea Salad with Feta, Almonds, and Prosciutto

Ingredients

- 1 tbsp.
- chopped fresh mint
- 1 tbsp.
- chopped fresh tarragon
- 1/2 c.
- plain yogurt
- 2 tbsp.
- mayonnaise
- 1 tsp.
- lemon zest, plus 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1
- clove garlic, chopped
- 1 tbsp.
- Dijon mustard
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 5 oz.
- watercress
- 5 oz.
- snap peas, trimmed and thinly sliced
- 2 OZ.
- Feta, crumbled (about 1/2 cup)
- 1
- carrot, cut into sticks
- 4
- radishes, cut into wedges
- 1/3 c.
- roasted almonds, chopped
- 4
- slices prosciutto, torn

Directions

Whisk together mint, tarragon, yogurt, mayonnaise, lemon zest and juice, garlic, and mustard in a bowl. Season with salt and pepper. Toss together watercress, snap peas, Feta, carrot, radishes, almonds, prosciutto, and half the dressing in a bowl. Serve with remaining dressing alongside.

Tip: When you prep snap peas, you'll want to remove the tough "string" that lines the outside edge. You can find stringless varieties and some stores sell them already trimmed, but we find that, if you put a little music on and give yourself about 5 minutes, it's an easy, dare we say meditative task. Just snap the very tip off one end of the pea and start pulling. You should see the string unzip from the inner side of the pea. A paring knife can also help.


