

Happy Trails - For the Love of Potholes!

I grew up in Saskatchewan, Canada and the first 6 years of my life were in Saskatoon. Up in the 'Great White North' the road pavement undergoes tremendous temperature swings along with rain and snow and all of that together deteriorates pavement and inevitably creates potholes. One day in Saskatoon a local radio station humorously posted a contents asking their listeners to describe the biggest pothole in the city. One listener called in and said that at a certain intersection there was a pothole so big he saw a periscope sticking out of it! He won! Riding a motorcycle/trike has its share of risks but one of the most common is hitting a pothole big encough to cause severe damage to your bike and, in some cases, causing you to wreck. Here are some tips to follow when riding to help avoid potholes.

- **Stay Vigilant**: The first and foremost rule for handling potholes is to stay vigilant. Keep a keen eye on the road ahead, scanning for any irregularities or obstacles, including potholes. Paying attention to the road surface can give you crucial seconds to react and maneuver safely around potholes.
- **Maintain a Safe Following Distance**: Maintaining a safe following distance from the vehicle in front of you is essential for two reasons. Firstly, it gives you more time to react to any sudden obstacles such as potholes. Secondly, if the vehicle ahead encounters a pothole and swerves to avoid it, you'll have enough space to adjust your own path without the risk of collision.
- **Slow Down**: Reducing your speed when approaching potholes is crucial for maintaining control and stability. High speeds increase the severity of impact if you hit a pothole and decrease the time available for you to react. Gradually decrease your speed as soon as you spot a pothole ahead, allowing for a smoother and safer maneuver around it.
- **Choose the Best Line**: When faced with a pothole, evaluate your options for the best line to navigate around it. Ideally, aim to go around the pothole rather than over it. Assess the traffic around you and choose a safe path that allows you to maintain control of your motorcycle while avoiding the hazard.
- **Use Correct Body Positioning**: If you can't avoid a pothole and will have to hit it you can increase your chances of surviving it by using proper body positioning which will help you maintain stability and control when navigating potholes. Shift your weight slightly back on the seat and grip the handlebars firmly while keeping your

Tires Part 2

Over the last 4 years I have been researching different motorcycle tires from Kenda to Michelin and this is some of my findings let's start with Kenda the bottom of the barrel pros it will hold air cons very noisy tire and wont grip in wet weather it doesn't ware good. Metzeler that is a good middle of the road tire price wise about the same as a Dunlop it is a quite tire but seems to ware fast on a Goldwing it doesn't have a great enough weight rating to carry a bike and 2 people up. Bridgestone tires are a very quite tire and handle the weight well and handle well in the wet weather but ware fast they are a soft compound tire so don't expect more than 7000 miles out of it. Dunlop tires have evolved and are a great quality and do well in wet weather and carry a good load you can expect to get about 8-9000 miles out of them but like Metzeler you can expect to pay 250 per tire on a average for them. Now one of my favorite Shinko tires I have been running them on my personal bike and I use 890 touring tire it is designed to vary more weight than any of the other tires I have been testing and is a very safe tire even in wet weather and I finally changed my set out at 11000 miles and still had life left in them . Michelin tires are another high quality tire it ware well and holds the weight well and there again you can only get about 8000 mils a set out of them the do well in wet weather and are the most expensive of the tires costing on average 3-350per tire. my summary is for the most part most of the tires are good some better than others in one way or another the main thing on motorcycles is proper inflation this will help any tire ware more even and last longer.


