### From Your Senior Chapter B Directors Tom & Merrilee Peck




Hi Everyone,



I would like to thank the Chapter for helping the PBTF for 12 years I think. Since we have closed that book (Ride for Kids), I have found a sister organization, called Starry Nights. They are more of a walk and run type of thing, which is a PBTF organization. The young lady that is in charge of it is Sarah Hamilton. She has a son Brodie, who is a brain tumor survivor. The Hamilton's are very involved in PBTF/ETCH fundraising. I am helping with any events that I can. So we missed the Smokies chuck a puck night, thru miscommunication but will get them on the schedule for 2021. Our friend Jerry Ciesla, who has been working with Smokies for the last few years, has got a benefit for Starry Night (Knoxville) and East TN Children's Hospital "base a ball" night on July 18<sup>th</sup> 2020. There will be a tennis ball throw for prizes supplied by the Smokies at the end of the game before the fireworks. We will sell the tennis balls and bag them like we did 2 years ago, we will get help from the Starry Night people, so that they can learn what to do. 

Lots of schools and businesses are using this great tool to be able to continue on with their school work and their business.


