2nd Annual Chili Cook-off







How to properly activate a new battery

This article is compliments of Lewis Preston at Electrical Connection, 3300A Rifle Range Rd, Knoxville, TN 37918, 865-219-9192, their website is <http://www.electricalconnection.com/> and as we finally are getting into cold weather, which is hard a batteries, and some of you MAY find it is time to



put a new battery into your motorcycle, this information may be timely for you.

Simply taking the battery out of the box, putting in acid and throwing on a quick charge will equal you losing a quarter of the battery life. The first charge will be the base of all future charging. Batteries have memories. Doing the following will give you the most charge capacity and the longest life.

First, get the tools you are going to need. You will be playing with acid, so have some safety glasses. Make your mom proud. Also get out a good quality trickle charger. I'm using one from Kisan Technologies.

Remove the foil strip.

Now you can see the fill ports. Note they are pointed. That's so they will pierce the foil on the acid container.



Pull off the plastic cover, but hang on to it. That's what you use to seal the fill ports later on.

This shows the foil seals after being punctured. I forgot to get a pic of the before. Just imagine foil covering the hole.

Oh...DO NOT puncture the foil. The battery will do it in the next step.


Place the acid container over the fill ports. Make sure you have your safety glasses on. Now gently push the acid container down puncturing the foil. Let the acid drain. Sometimes you need to lightly squeeze the acid container.

Once all the acid is in, cover the fill ports with a wet paper towel.

Attach your trickle charger. Leave it alone until your charger shows its done. That's it. Now it's a waiting game.

Once your charger turns green, shuts off, sends you a text or whatever it does to indicate you are fully charged, throw on some gloves and remove the paper towel (there will be some acid on the paper towel).

Install the black sealing cap that was on your acid container.

Some roadway repairs may have involved the re-painting of lane lines. These re-painting projects are sometimes done in a hurry without the use of road cones to allow a proper drying time before being exposed to traffic. Many road paints are oil based and silicone is added to speed drying time and extend wear. Also, the addition of glass beads give the lines a reflective quality. When the paint process is done on a windy day or cars are allowed to drive over the fresh paint smearing it along the roadway, a new even more slippery road surface exists for us to deal with as glass beads are like miniature ball bearings on the pavement.

Keep this in mind when you see smeared road paint on the pavement. These painted lines are also very slippery when wet. Until next time, ride safer

Although most of January gave us snow and colder temps, the last few days of the month warmed up to the point that we all saw a few motorcycles come out on the road. What a great feeling to be out riding in the last week of January! When taking your bike out during one of these weather breaks, don't forget to do a good TCLOCKS inspection right after removing your battery maintainer connections. Underinflated tires are almost guaranteed due to the cold temps we have seen during storage.

Once out on the road, watch for changes in the color of the pavement. Even though these are probably routes that you are familiar with, you may encounter a section of road that may have undergone a temporary repair or may show signs of loose gravel from a recent "seal coating" operation where loose gravel may have been spread over sticky tar to seal cracks in the pavement. Traction always suffers when gravel is present whether you are on two or three wheels.



