Ride Like You're Invisible!





I'd like to introduce you to **Scott Wiens** and of course his wife, Hedie. New to Chapter B they will be writing an article called Happy Trails. Jerry decided to take a break so a Big Thanks Scott for stepping up to help cover some safety aspects in our sport that is so much needed.

In 1992 I was riding my 86' Goldwing (Clyde) in a rural part of Central Florida. My wife and I lived in Texas at the time and we had ridden to Florida to see family. I was riding solo on a nice rural two lane road and was making a turn to my left. The oncoming traffic turning on the same highway had a designated turning lane to the right with a yield sign to yield to traffic (like me) turning onto the same highway. As chance would have it, a minivan was coming from the other way and turning onto the same road. I had the right of way...they were supposed to yield. Notice I said 'supposed to' yield. As I made my left turn I was carefully watching the minivan navigate their turn. The woman driving the minivan made her turn and as we came parallel to each other she turned her head, looked me directly in the eye and blew right past the yield sign cutting me off. I hit the brakes, the horn and shouted something that definitely wasn't 'Jesus Loves You' (I've repented since).

As I continued to follow the minivan into town my heartbeat slowly calmed down, my anger ebbed away and I suddenly recalled the words the previous owner of my Goldwing said to me when he sold me the bike; "Ride like you're invisible!"

I learned that day his advice was true! It doesn't matter if the driver of a vehicle sees you and even if they make eye contact with you, you must always assume they are going to act as if they don't see you. I remember relaying this advice and story to a younger, novice motorcycle rider. He got a little indignant at the conclusion and responded; 'But you had the right of way!' My response to him was 'So?' I went on to explain to him that if I had claimed my right of way I'm confident the police would have ticketed the lady in the minivan whose vehicle would have a slight dent in the driver's side and I would be probably be laying in a hospital bed with physical injuries and a totaled Goldwing. The claiming of that 'right of way' would not be worth the price! On a motorcycle we can't prove a point with other motorists...it almost always ends badly for us.

I realize that our GWRRA chapter is filled with many experienced riders who know and live by simple but critical riding principles such as this and each one of you can probably tell even more harrowing stories of how this principle and others saved your bacon. I just wanted to share it as a reminder to all of us to ride like we are invisible and stay safe.

On a personal note, I'm grateful to be given the chance to write the Happy Trails articles for our newsletter. Thanks again for welcoming Hedie and I into the GWRRA Chapter B. We can't wait for the first ride of the year!



The biggest problem with Goldwing and Spider saddle bags like every bike or trike has is adjustment to lids and trunk covers. When they get out of adjustment they will indicate a trunk open or left or right side saddlebag lid is open. There are several things we have found that cause this. The most common is the striker hooks come loose and move. A person one time showed me the simple way at set is to pull down on the striker as you tighten the screws the small amount of slack makes it fit almost perfect. Also another issue we have run into is bolts stripping out where the screw goes into the plastic. We found a small amount of plastic epoxy and put some in the hole, spray WD40 on

the screw, screw in, and let set overnight. Then next morning, unscrew your screw and mount the striker in a fresh new hole. Another problem found on trike trunks is the type of articulating hinges, If they get out of adjustment it will cause it to drag on the striker or in some cases make you think it's staying locked. The tolerances are so tight there is very little room for error so it's vital to align and check alignment regularly and lube hinges and strikers and latches. It's important to remember that when you get to a destination and want your favorite hat or a brush to brush your bald head or a drink out of a cooler it's nice to know you can.




