




#### **Helmet Selection**

If you are like me (I know, I know...scary thought) you want to be as comfortable as possible as you ride your motorcycle. You want the position you are riding in to be natural and comfortable. You want a seat that makes your tushy oh so cushy (yes, I wrote that), and you want all the unwanted elements of temperature extremes and excessive wind to be controlled to make your ride pleasurable. After all, we don't want to be thinking of those things, we want to be enjoying the ride.

One of the most important factors that impact our riding comfort is our helmet. A helmet that is ill-fitting and uncomfortable is a huge distraction as is a helmet that is noisy. Below are a few tips to consider when buying a helmet.

Find a Helmet Brand That Best Fits The Shape of Your Head – Just look around our meeting on a given first Tuesday night and you will see many different shaped heads (try not to laugh out loud as some folks like Scott or Wally may be self-conscious about the shape of their heads). Typically head shapes fall into three types: Round Oval, Intermediate Oval and Long Oval (see picture). Many helmet manufacturers will make their helmets favoring one of these shapes alt-



hough they won't typically post that on their websites. Once you have determined your personal head shape find an experienced rider with a similarly shaped head and ask him or her what brand of helmet they wear and then go try on some helmets of that brand. At Wing Ding last year (a moment of silence please) there was a vendor set up there who had various helmet brands you could try on. It was very helpful.

Select a Style – This is a very personal preference but there are some practical factors to consider when selecting a style of helmet. I rode many years with an open face helmet because I didn't like the enclosed feeling of a full-face helmet. However, full-face helmets are safer by far in the event you have a wreck as they protect your jaw and face so much better. One of the more popular helmet styles is the modular helmet that allows the bottom part of the front of the helmet to rotate up which helps when trying to talk while stopped or when getting your helmet on and off as you preparing to ride or shut down from a ride. You should seriously consider factoring in safety and practicality when selecting your style and again, talk to people who have the style you are thinking about buying and ask them what they like and don't like about that style of helmet.

Check Safety Ratings – Not all helmets are as safe as others. Safety ratings on helmets are mandated and any DOT compliant helmet sold in the U.S. must have the a rating sticker on the back of the helmet that should

include the manufacturers name on the top and then the specific DOT rating that states *FMVSS No. 218 Certified*. However, buyer beware! Many novelty helmets may have DOT stickers yet they are not certified. I found that you can actually buy DOT stickers and some sellers do this put them on their helmets which is, of course, fraudulent.

There are many other things to consider about selecting a helmet but in the end find one that safe and comfortably fits your head you can't go wrong. Oh, and even if you have an odd shaped head like mine, there is a helmet out there that will fit you. Protect the dome and make it home!

#### **Goldwing fluid locations**

Some people are unaware of locations and what fluids to use so I have come up with a chart of fluid locations

#### **Brakes:**

Front on right handlebar

Rear brakes remove chrome side cover right side reservoir towards the front

Fluid: DOT4 brake fluid

#### Clutch:

Left handlebar

Fluid: DOT4 brake fluid

#### **Coolant:**

Radiator cap located under right dash pocket area or on 2012 -17 same locations but dash removal necessary to gain access

Coolant recovery tank fill left side of bike near left foot peg

Fluid: antifreeze 50-50 mixed with water

#### **Motor Oil:**

Remove chrome cover on right and towards the rear is a dip stick going in the engine Fluid: 10W40 Honda line Oil or Mobil 1 10W40 racing4T oil

#### Rear Differential:

On a 2-wheeler it located beside right exhaust on deferential Housing. In a 3-wheeler it's located on deferential in different locations according to manufacture.

Fluid: on 2wheeler it uses Honda gear oil

Trikes need to reference manufacture for fluid recommendations.

#### Blinker Fluid:

All models behind the left rear blinker

Fluid: Blinker Fluid 20-20 extra strength for best results

#### **Bacon Biscuits with Strawberry Butter**

#### Ingredients

#### **Biscuits:**

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 tablespoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 8 tablespoons shortening
- <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> cup buttermilk
- ½ cup crispy bacon bits
- 1 tablespoon butter, melted

Makes: 8 biscuits
Prep Time: 15 minutes
Cook Time: 20 minutes
Total Time: 35 minutes









#### **Strawberry Butter:**

½ cup strawberry preserves

½ cup butter, softened

1/4 cup strawberries, chopped

#### Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 425 degrees.
- 2. In a large mixing bowl, combine the flour, baking powder and salt. Cut in the shortening until the mixture forms coarse crumbles resembling small peas. Stir in buttermilk and bacon until just combined.
- 3. Roll out dough and cut into 8 biscuits (about 2½ inches each). Brush tops with melted butter and bake for 10 to 12 minutes until golden.
- 4. While biscuits bake, prepare the strawberry butter. In a medium bowl, combine strawberry preserves, butter and strawberries. Stir until creamy and combined.
- 5. Serve biscuits warm with strawberry butter on top.



Chapter Director, Chapter Safety/Ride Coordinator, Chapter Treasurer

The Directors would be appointed by the Director above them and the Director would appoint their own Team with approval of the Team above them, like the Chapter SRC would be appointed by the CD with approval of the DSRC and so on.
