Happy Trails



So this month we ask the question: Where is the best spot to park my motorcycle within a parking lot space? Well, I've been making a point to fellow riders about this for a long time and now I see that the Motorcycle Safety Foundation agrees with me. A large group of motorcycles parking in a lot with marked spaces is not a problem as long as the lot is fairly open and all the bikes can be parked together. The problem arises when only a few spaces are available between groups of cars and say that there are only 2 bikes in your group. Park so the rear of your bike (or the front, if you've backed into the space) is at the entrance of the space, similar to where the rear of the average car would be positioned. In this way, a "driver" or other rider hunting for

a space will see your bike and not start to enter the space and then come upon your bike at the last moment. Oh yes, I've seen this happen many times before usually when the car driver smashes into somebody's bike and hurriedly backs out and flees the scene.


If you are traveling with other riders, try to park two to a space if possible, to minimize the group's "footprint". If the spaces in the lot seem too narrow, don't chance getting your bike damaged by a neighboring cars' doors. If you're riding a trike, you will probably require an entire space for the larger machine. Lastly, when leaving a parking space, be alert for motorists distracted by their own quest to find parking.



Cleaning a Goldwing

When cleaning a Goldwing certain care needs to be taken with washing, cleaning windshields, cleaning chrome, waxing and cockpit care. There are hundreds of products out there for washing waxing polishing tires you name it there is a product to either clean it or to protect it.

Washing: There are as many methods for washing as there are supplies but if the bike has been ridden you should let it cool off first as it could cause damage to engines if cold water is sprayed on a hot engine. What I have found to be very effective is to purchase motorcycle bike wash. It can be purchased at places like Cycle gear, Knoxville Honda or on line Amazon eBay. This product is simple to use, just spray it on wait about 2 min and rinse off. It dissolves dirt and releases it from the bike. After this step I recommend washing the entire motorcycle with carwash soap like you use on your car, as the bike has the same type finishes on the body. Using a soft sponge or mitt, wash the body and rinse, the results will be astonishing. Cockpit care: Protecting the dash, controls and trim pieces are often forgotten you can use Armor All or similar products to keep your bike looking like new but a I product that was introduced to me about a year ago beats everything I have ever used. it's called SC1 by maxima. This is a high gloss protectant which reduces dirt build up on bikes this can be purchase on line or at Honda of Knoxville or Cycle Gear.



Waxing: When waxing a motorcycle I have found it difficult to wax without getting it all over the trim. With new products on the market, now one I use is Turtle Wax Ice spray wax. this wax can be sprayed directly on the bike and wiped off with a microfiber towel and if it happens to get on trim it leaves no residue or turning plastics white.

Chrome Cleaning: There is 3 major types of Chrome #1 chrome plated steel. #2 polished stainless steel #3 chrome plastic best cleaned with steel wool or carwash
