






## Happy Trails







No sense is more important than vision for riding a motorcycle, except maybe "common" sense. Our ability to see, track, navigate and decipher visual signals is extraordinary in both its ability and sophistication of design. Malfunctions of this system can be devastating. Of all the nerve fibers bringing information to the brain for processing, approximately half are related to vision. At the back of everyone's eyeball is a specialized layer known as the retina. The retina has three major areas; 1) Detail-oriented central area, to sense color with a high "pixel" count, 2) Larger surrounding area, oriented to black and white, with a lower resolution, and 3) a blind spot, where the nerve fibers leaving the retina travel back to the brain.

Information is sorted to different areas of the brain to help with deciphering. Our visual camera is equivalent to a 500-megapixel chip, with a dynamic range of 20+ stops (how bright to how dark you can see at once). Modern high end digital cameras have about 50 megapixels, and 12 stops of dynamic range.

With the first six months of this year being so upside down it's finally starting to re-open many places like vision centers which we aging bikers should visit probably every year or two. If you value your eye-sight as much as I do, try to make an appointment to have your vision checked so you can maintain your edge while riding.

#### **Honda Goldwings Storage**

Goldwings have a number of storage spaces from glove boxes on console panel to saddle bags or a large spacious trunk. But like all parts of a motorcycle often need service about 2 times a year, you should look at them and see if anything needs to be readjusted or lubricated. If saddle bags or trunk are not working correctly this could cause a false dash alarm Trunk Open or Saddle bag open indicator. Also these areas have seals that keep the water out they need to be inspected for tears or leaks. A great remedy to help these seals is to coat them once or twice a year with Vaseline this will help keep your seals soft and expand them to make a firm seal and reduce the chance for water to leak in. This also holds true on trikes on the under trunk. I have had to repair several sealing issues and adjust hinges and latches to get them to operate freely.

Trunk organizers are a great thing to have in your trunk. They bolt up into the roof of the trunk lid and are great for important papers, hair brush, or small items you might keep in the trunk so you can find them quickly when you need them. They also manufacture netting for both Goldwing and Spiders to hold gear in bags in your

trunk or saddlebags.




