Our Roan Mountain Steak-Out Adventure

We've attended Chapter C's Roan Mt. Steak out every year since we joined Chapter B. They do a fantastic job, providing a bean supper on Fri. evening, activities all day Sat., followed by the steak dinner that afternoon. Worth the "trip" over there!

What's the difference between a "trip" and an "adventure"? In our case, about 300 extra miles, and not knowing for sure just where you are or where you're heading.

Since it's about 181 miles from Lafollette to Roan Mt., Gary and Dianah, Jo Ann, Peanut, Chuck (Trail Boss) and I chose to rent a cabin in the State Park again and stay two nights. Peanut worked until noon, but planned to ride his new Trike over and meet us there. The rest of us met Fri. morning at Hardees's and left there about 10:00. We were all on our bikes, except Dianah, who brought so much stuff she had to drive her car. (Actually, I think she might have watched the weather report and wanted to stay dry.)

Jo Ann had mentioned that she'd like to take scenic side roads (she's trying to build stamina for the Niagara Falls trip in July), so the trail boss (Chuck) had mapped out a route that would take us towards Asheville. There



we would pick up the Blue Ridge Parkway, and visit Grandfather Mountain, before cutting off to head for Roan Mt. (We've been there twice in recent years, but unable to go up because of the weather). The weather was absolutely gorgeous as we began our "trip". We stopped for lunch just before jumping on the Parkway.

I think it was at this point that our "trip" began to take on the characteristics of an "adventure". Dianah needed to check in to secure our cabin by 3:00, so it was decided that she would take the shorter route and go on ahead, while the rest of us headed for Grandfather Mt.

Trail Boss had told me it would only be a short distance, maybe 25 extra miles, to go by Grandfather Mt. before heading for Roan Mt., giving us plenty of time to get there before the bean supper at 6:00. Chapter Educator Section

Spring time is always one of our favorite times of the year to ride, the weather is usually not too hot and places are not so crowded. Many of the fun events are also scheduled in the spring. With the beautiful spring riding season also brings the possibility of isolated thunderstorms and down-right deluges. As we all know if you ride a motorcycle you better be ready to get wet. What I would like to do in this article is share with you a few experiences and recommendations.

The best thing to do if you ride into an approaching storm is get off the road and wait till the storm passes; usually they are short and narrow bands of rain. If the heavy rain slows and you intend to continue with your ride hopefully you have some good rain gear. Best to pull off in a safe place, hopefully you can find a place to get under cover; a closed bank drive-through, church or service station over hangs work good to stop and wait out the storm or to just put the rain gear on.

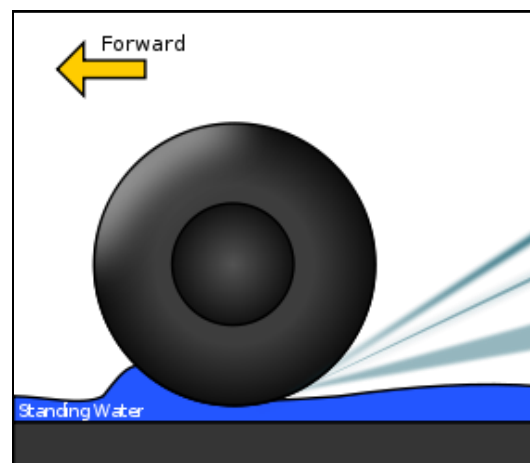
Continuing on in the rain can be safe but everyone has a different degree of comfort in the rain. Slow your speed, watch for puddles and standing water on the road. Two wheelers do better than one might expect on wet streets, you have to be more cautious when you accelerate and when you apply your brakes; slow and easy is always the best technique. Those on a trike may feel more stable but those two rear wheels have a much wider footprint than that of a 2-wheeler. The automotive type tires are much more susceptible to hydroplaning. The weight of the trike, light in comparison to

a automobile, can become very unstable on wet streets. Those who have not experienced this phenomenon need to know and be aware of hydroplaning. Moving out of a tire track with a 2-wheeler to avoid puddles might not be as easy if you have 3 wheels. You might be able to keep the front wheel on the high but the rear wheels are still in the tire tracks that usually have the standing water in them.

Again, it's best to slow down or just pull over until the roads drain from a heavy rain. Just use caution. On your next set of rear tires for your trike you may want to consider a higher water dispersing tread design more favorable to riding on wet highways.

Ride safe.

Information below copied from Wikipedia

- Under inflation can cause a tire to deflect inward, raising the tire center and preventing the tread from clearing water.
- Worn tires will hydroplane more easily for lack of tread depth.
- The longer and thinner the contact patch, the less likely a tire will hydroplane.

If the drive wheels hydroplane, there may be a sudden audible rise in engine RPM and indicated speed as they begin to spin. In a broad highway turn, if the front wheels lose traction, you can suddenly begin to drift towards the outside of the bend. If the rear wheels lose traction, the back will begin to slew out sideways into a skid. If both your rear wheels hydroplane at once, you can slide in a straight line, again towards the outside of the bend if in a turn. When any or all of the wheels regain traction, there may be a sudden jerk in whatever direction that wheel is pointed.
