Successfully Navigating Switchbacks: Part 1 – Downhill Switchbacks

In last month's newsletter I wrote part one of a two-part series on navigating switchbacks on a two-wheeler. That article was about navigating a switchback while heading downhill. In this article we will discuss navigating switchbacks while riding uphill.

Right out of the gate it is important to know that the level of difficulty is higher when going around a switchback while heading uphill. This is due to a couple of factors. First, you don't have the full visibility that you typically have when heading downhill and secondly, when going uphill the motorcycle is under power versus braking when going downhill. I have never had an anxious moment navigating a switchback while heading downhill but I have had a couple going uphill. If you two-wheel riders are honest you will probably agree.

- With that as a background let's cover some tips for successfully navigating a switchback while travelling uphill: **1. Get to the Correct Speed BEFORE Entering the Switchback** The right speed is always a matter of the rider's judgment, and it will largely depend upon the tightness of the switchback. However, it is AL-WAYS better to go in too slow than too fast. Slowing down on an uphill switchback means you will be on the brake for a second or two and then must immediately apply the throttle. This can be done but it is more of a challenge and is commonly the cause of riders falling over.
 - 2. Get Your Bike into the Right Gear BEFORE Entering the Switchback I can't emphasize this enough. You are about to navigate a tight turn while heading uphill so you MUST be in the correct gear so the bike will have the torque to pull you through the entire turn. For most of the tight switchbacks that we ride on the smaller roads here in East Tennessee that gear should be 1st or 2nd. The danger of being in too high a gear will be obvious to most all of you. When you need to apply the throttle to keep control through the turn and your bike is in too high a gear, the engine will bog down, and you won't have the torque you need. That means you are in danger of losing control of the bike.
 - **3. Turn Your Head in the Direction of the Curve** These last three points I mentioned in the first article but are still important to note. Don't forget to turn your head and eyes and focus on the curve and not what is directly in front of the bike.
 - **4. Handlebar Steer** Because a switchback is such a sharp turn you will be going slow and therefore must handlebar steer.
 - **5. Remember Outside-Inside-Outside** As I mentioned last week, use the technique of starting on the outside (right) part of your lane, move to the inside (left) of your lane as you go through the switchback (close to the center line) and then back to the outside as you come out of the switchback. It will take some of the sharp angle out of the curve which in turn should help you navigate it more effectively.

Hope this helps. In upcoming articles I am planning on writing some articles specifically for the trike riders in our midst. As part of my research for these I will be talking to a few in addition to my other research as, of course, I am not a trike rider (yet).









Brake light switches on a Goldwing there are several switches sometime they get corroded and quit working the switches are located underneath the controls on the right side touching the brake lever when pulling in the brake lever you should hear a audible click but it doesn't mean the switch is actually working if you are having brake light issues or cruise control problems this is what I would look at first sometimes it's as simple and working the switch back and forth other time you have to replace switch.

Clutch switch there is actually two switches one for starting one to disengage cruise control the same applies to them about cleaning and replacements if necessary.
