

GPS Dash Mount

This month's article is about a really nifty item available from Electrical Connection right here in Knoxville. This is something we have on our own motorcycle and absolutely love it. This product that I discuss below applies for people wanting to mount their GPS, satellite radio, cell phone, etc., onto their motorcycle.

In the past, I used the same method as quite a number of riders have on their motorcycles for mounting things, our GPS unit was connected to a "Ram Mount" fastened to my clutch bolts. All the time I had our GPS on that Ram Mount, I had that itchy feeling in the back of my neck about safety and my concerns of taking my eyes totally off the road to look down and to my left to see the screen on the GPS. I just wasn't comfortable about that much of a deviation from watching the road. I got involved in a conversation about this with Lewis Preston at Electrical Connection, and he told me he was working on an idea he had about a solution, and we ended up using my motorcycle as his test bed for his idea.

What he has come up with is a mount that fastens to the center of the dash, with a mounting that has enough mounting holes on the main plate to fit just about any configuration of GPS, satellite radio, cell phone, etc., for mounting your device to it. In my mind the major advantage to this dash mount is that it is in direct line of sight from my eyes to the road ahead. All I have to do is slightly lower my viewpoint to see the screen, and I can still see the road ahead, watching for any possible situations.

Below is a picture from the side of the mount on the dash with a GPS connected to it, and a picture of the two pieces that make up the unit that are fastened to the dash: How Lewis connected our GPS to his mount on our Gold Wing is very neat, and very functional. The mount is fastened to the dash with a clamp-type of setup, with a thumb-screw holding everything tight (and we have had it on the bike for over 77,000 miles and it is still stable). The original output wiring for the GPS, that supplies the necessary power and connection for the audio output, is looped under the mount and through a hole drilled into the under-side of the dash and run back inside the dash to the necessary connections in the bike. The audio output is connected to the aux connection under the left fairing pocket, so the audio prompts from the GPS unit come into our helmet headsets (the same concept would apply for any other type of devices connected that would have audio output).

This Electrical Connection dash mount lists for \$49.95 and according to their website as of this printing, the units are in stock, ready for delivery. The mounting is fabricated from 16 gauge steel and black powder-coated. One caveat about this product, it will not work as well with windshields that have a vent, as the vent and the mount get in the way of each other. But bottom line, at least to me, is it is a very neat method for having your GPS, or satellite radio, or cellphone, in the optimum positioning for safety and utility.



about your "situational awareness" while riding getting you in trouble with law enforcement. that will go along with those crash avoidance skills.

Situational awareness makes you alert to clues that allow you to "read" the environment and predict when a potentially bad situation is about to unfold before anything obvious actually happens. Unusual changes in traffic flow or the sight of unexpected brake lights can indicate trouble ahead. You can be a better rider if you fine tune your observation skills and watch for a distracted driver who may be attempting to do multiple tasks besides the basic function of piloting his vehicle down the road. Scan the road ahead and ask yourself if the "picture" looks as it should. If not, then slow down and cover those brakes.

Situational awareness involves more than just your familiar senses. It also includes your sixth sense that you develop as a rider. You know, it's that gut feeling you get when something just isn't right. Developing your sixth sense takes a deeper level of awareness and conscious attention. This is not only critical when dealing with other drivers in traffic, but it also

plays an important role even when it's just you and the open road. Staying sharp can help you spot potentially hazardous road conditions or tricky turns that require immediate action.

Remember that those evasive maneuvers and braking skills that you learned are your second line of defense, not you're first. Being aware of your surroundings and road conditions will often reduce your need to employ those emergencv tactics.


