What's the biggest risk motorcyclists face in traffic? Well, in my opinion left turning drivers are probably near the top of the list. Turning left in traffic requires concentration and attention that some drivers don't have, and once these drivers make their fatal mistake, they've pretty much created a no-win, no escape situation for a motorcyclist. I'll tell you how to improve your odds in high-risk, left-turning-car situations. It's called shadowing. Approaching an intersection with cars waiting to to turn, ride in the visual "shadow" of a larger vehicle, preferably a much larger vehicle while you are in the lane next to theirs. Line up your front tire with the rear bumper of the larger vehicle (truck). While this is not normally a real safe place to be, using the large vehicle's roadway presence will shield you from a possible left turning 3 ton SUV.

Yes, I'm telling you to purposely ride in the truck's No-Zone momentarily to use the truck as a "safety" barrier. Be cautious and ready to brake should your blocker decide to change lanes. Once past the potential left-turning hazard, you need to immediately back off, or speed up and find another good riding position. If you're going to be dealing with the same situation repeatedly in an urban setting it might be wise to just back off and re-use that large vehicle again at another intersection.

Obviously this safety trick will probably not work for group rides, however sometimes there can be safety in numbers if every rider is alert.

Symbols and images associated with Ireland and St Patrick's Day

The national flag of Ireland, also known as the Irish tricolor, appears throughout St Patrick's Day parades, events and celebrations. The green stripe stands for Irish Catholics, while the orange stripe represents Irish Protestants. The central white stripe also represents the hope for peace between the two groups.

The patron saint of Ireland is traditionally linked to the red Saltire of St Patrick, which was used to form the the flag of the United Kingdom.

St Patrick is also associated with blue, after the creation of the Order of St Patrick in the 1780s made it the official color. "St Patrick's Blue" can be found on Ireland's Presidential Standard, and in the plume of bearskins worn by the Irish Guards.

The legend of the Leprechaun has also become a modern-day symbol of Ireland. Known for their mischievous behavior and leaving pots of gold at the end of rainbows, today, the mythical creatures feature heavily as a tourist symbol and some people choose to wear Leprechaun costumes and hats to St Patrick's Day parades. Dublin even has its very own Leprechaun Museum.

I have heard people complain about overheating climbing steep hills and after reading several forums on this problem and experiencing it first hand I come up with a solution. First of all there are 4 major problems that create this problem 1 recovery tank cracking 2 a kinked or collapsed recovery tank hose 3 a bad thermostat and finally 4 a bad radiator cap. the industry as a whole recommends changing antifreeze every 24 months.

Coolant additives

There are several name brand coolant additive on the market that help reduce heat of coolant as much as 20% I personally have used several brands of this product and works well to reduce engine heat with no adverse affects but you must follow directions


> 5 team members and you wasn't able to use your hands, I have to say I really sucked at this and it didn't help with all the giggling that Julie was doing, another challenge was


a scavenger hunt. During the ticket draw we had several

people win stuff including Patty winning several things. All in all it was a lot of fun day and I hope they keep the same format for next year's meeting.












