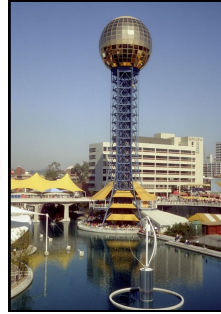

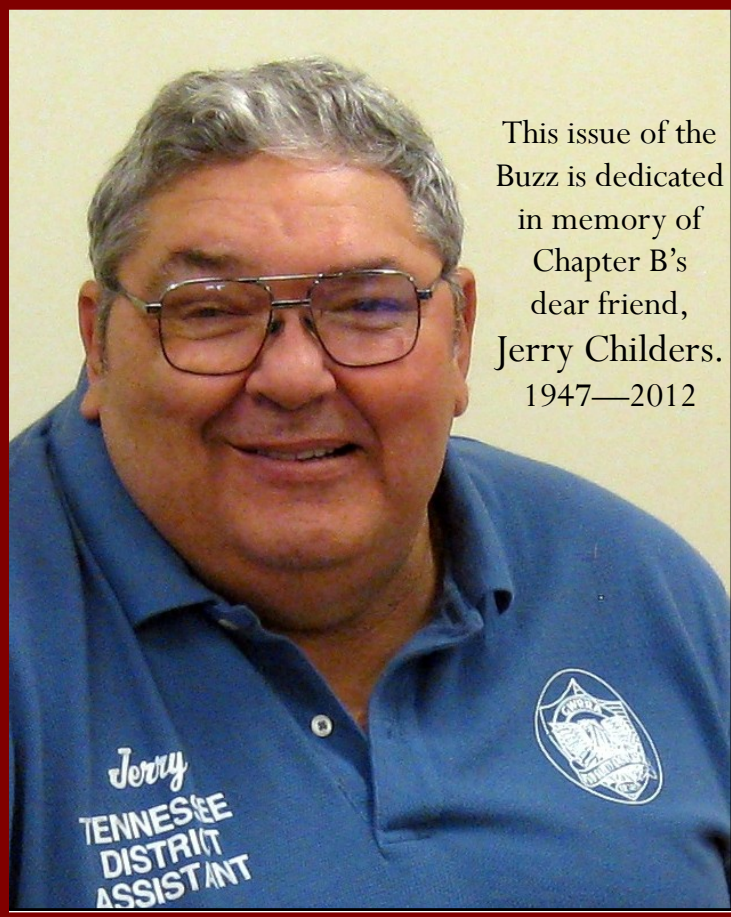

Program Dates: January 1, 2012 to December 31, 2012

Program Details

- For every five new memberships you recruit (households), you will receive a gift certificate with the equivalent value of a Family Membership - **\$55**.

RULES:

- 1) ALL performers must have a full registration for the rally (no day passes).
- 2) At least one member of the act must be a full member of GWRRA.
- 3) All performers must be amateurs only.
- 4) No more than one act per category, per chapter.
- 5) Time limit for each act is 5 minutes only.
- 6) Any act that is not in good taste (any sexually suggestive material) will be disqualified. Please remember this is a 'family' show. Decision of the Talent Show Coordinators is final. You will be contacted by the Talent Show Coordinator after your application has been received.
- 7) All acts must be original for 2012. Contestants that performed in 2011 or previous years must not use previously presented material.
- 8) The performers will furnish all props and equipment (sound system will be provided – bring your own music on suitable format).

JUDGING CRITERIA: The various acts will be judged on their freshness and imagination, unique novelty and inventiveness and quality of performance presentation.

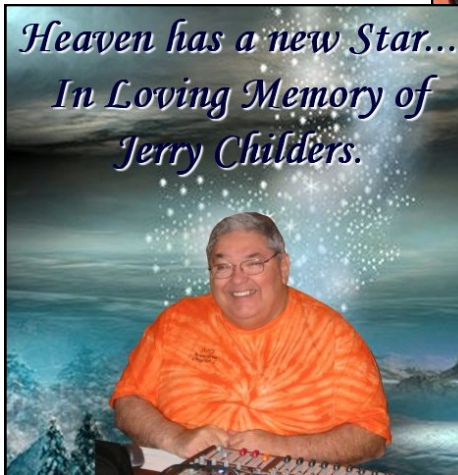

Survey Says!



There seemed to be a lot of enthusiasm from the Chapter Directors and the Assistant Chapter Directors in attendance at our roundtable discussion about the possibility of moving Spring Fling and perhaps to even consider moving the event every two or three years similar to Wing Ding.

A Chapter Director from Kentucky and a former Chapter Director from Ohio commented about their experiences when they have brought their chapters to Spring Fling. The Ohio Director pointed out that his chapter had routinely captured the award as being the largest chapter from outside the District in attendance. He pointed out that, depending upon where the new site was located, the distance may be further. HOWEVER, the travel time may actually be less because of the typical traffic congestion between Exit 407 on I-40 and the convention site.

As this topic was being discussed, one of our Eastern Chapter Directors appropriately suggested that the membership should be surveyed to determine if moving from Pigeon Forge would cause them to be less likely to attend Spring Fling or perhaps increase the likelihood that they'd consider attending.

Ed Grazier, our Region N Director, pointed out that both North Carolina and Ken-

tucky had moved their conventions sites for their 2012 Conventions and Rally and that perhaps it was appropriate that Tennessee entertain the same considerations.

Not being quite sure where or what the box is, the Directors were encouraged to *"Think outside of the box"* not only in regard to Spring Fling but also about the Fall Event and even Winter Event. Several ideas of things that had been a lot of fun but haven't been done in a while were suggested.

So, all of that to say..... we have heard you AND we are paying attention to what you have been saying. Now we need your assistance to get the FUN factor back or at least boosted. As you know, it takes a while to plan and implement a fun day and this will be no different, however we do want to hear your suggestions.

By the way, if you have a suggestion where you'd like to see Spring Fling moved to....tell us! *If you have any suggestions on this subject please contact your Chapter Director or Assistant Chapter Director to voice your opinion.*

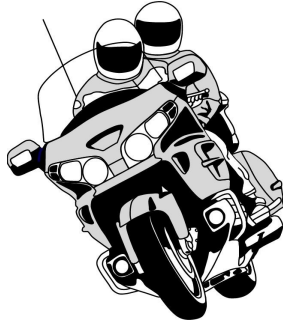
Photo of an actual quilt that was constructed for, and awarded at the 2011 Virginia Convention

Chapter Educator Section

The Smart Corner

Dave Roberts, Chapter Educator

This month's article has been very difficult for me to write as I've started and torn up several drafts. I was intending to write about being prepared for spring and the beginning of riding season, but I can't stop thinking about Charles Collins. Right about now you're asking, who is Charles Collins? If you'll stay with me, I hope I can make this article make since to you.



Right after I sent off last month's article to Tom, Betty and I were shocked to learn that Dr. Charles Collins had died that morning in a canoeing accident. We had had dinner just a couple of nights before with Charles and his wife at their lovely home overlooking beautiful Keauhou Bay on the island of Hawaii. We were stunned, I still am.

Charles was participating in the morning "paddle" in a double canoe (the "safest" kind) with 9 other people; something he had done hundreds of times before. (I had paddled with his canoe club on several occasions.) What happened? Why? The investigation is still ongoing, but one of the outcomes has been a complete safety review by the Keauhou Canoe Club to better mitigate the risk of going out on the ocean in a canoe. --Being Better Prepared.

What does any of this have to do with motorcycles? I guess the open road, like the ocean, can bite if you're not prepared.

For the record; yes, I was a Boy Scout and I've taken their motto to heart. Being prepared is particularly important to us as riders/co-riders. What do I mean by being prepared?

First, is your motorcycle prepared? Tires properly inflated and with sufficient tread? Brakes in good working order? How 'bout the lights? Brake lights? Turn signals? All these are critical to the safe operation of the motorcycle.

Next, how about you? Are you well rested? Do you have the right frame of mind or is something weighing on you? Are you taking

any medications that might make you drowsy? Haven't been drinking, have you? Riding requires your FULL attention so anything that diminishes your ability to pay attention to the task limits your ability to safely operate your bike/trike. What about your riding gear? Helmet ok? gloves not torn? What about your riding jacket? Boots? Are they looking a little tired? If they look tired they probably are.

Then there's your emergency skills. When is the last time that you PRACTICED emergency maneuvers? You know, things like swerving to avoid an obstacle in your path of travel. Emergency stopping, practiced that lately? In about 13% of motorcycle crashes, the rider made NO attempt to avoid the crash; no swerving, no braking, just rode right into the collision. Unfortunately, most riders NEVER practice emergency maneuvers. (You will practice a lot of emergency maneuvers in the rider course that I hope you will sign up for.)

Do you consciously practice your other riding skills? You know, things like your scanning for hazards, looking through turns, covering your controls as you approach congested areas, positioning yourself so you are as visible as possible, etc. While all these things (and more) should be "second nature" focusing on them while you're riding reinforces the action.

Paddling an outrigger canoe on the open ocean requires proper training, the right equipment, and a knowledge of your capabilities for the conditions.--Riding a motorcycle requires no less.
