1/4 cup freshly squeezed lime juice 4 cloves crushed garlic

- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. black pepper

#### For Chicken Breasts:

6 6oz. each, skinless, boneless chicken breasts

#### For Corn Relish:

1 cup corn kernels 1 seeded and chopped jalapeno pepper 1/4 cup diced red bell pepper 1/2 cup chopped cilantro 2 Tbsp. Freshly squeezed lime juice 1/2 tsp. salt



Directions: For marinade, mix ingredients together and pour into a large, plastic reseal able bag. Place chicken breasts in bag, shake to coat, and refrigerate for 2 hrs.-or overnight. For corn relish: Mix together all ingredients for corn relish. Set aside. To grill: Set clean, well oiled grill to medium heat. When the grill is hot, use tongs to place chicken on

grill. Cook 4-6 minutes per side. Remove chicken from grill when juices run clear and place on serving platter. Spoon a laver of corn relish over the top of each chicken breast. Serve with Bush's Black Bean Fiesta Grillin' Beans.

# The Smart Corner

Most of you have had enough of my safety ranting over the past few years, but this year's trip to Spring Fling provided a couple of teachable moments which were just too good to pass up.

How many times have you heard about the importance of a pre-ride inspection?--well here's a real case in point. I hadn't ridden the Goldwing since the infamous January 12th impromptu ride. (Don't remember that one?--the one with the 10:00am meet at Shoney's on Emory road--that was cancelled by email at 8:47 am --just about the time I left my garage--something about rain somewhere in East Tennessee. (I rode 200 miles that day without a drop.)) As I was looking over the tires, I noticed a drop of oil on the garage floor on the right side by rear tire. Closer inspection revealed a finger-tight gear lube drain plug which had been leaking over the past 3 months of inactivity, and gear oil was everywhere, especially on the rear tire.

It's a good thing that I had started the pre-ride inspection on Tuesday, as this allowed me enough time to drain the remaining oil from the rear end, fill with new gear oil, and be ready to depart for Chattanooga on Thursday morning

How long has it been since you checked your rear-end oil level? (We have some friends from North Carolina who rode to Wing Ding in Texas without checking and promptly blew up the rear end on their GoldWing due to lack of oil.)

Thursday's ride down to Chattanooga was uneventful, but Friday dawned such a beautiful day, Emily, Joann, Betty and I decided to ride through the Chickamauga National Battlefield Park which was only about 5 miles from the Spring Fling rally site. It was a glorious day and the park was in such spring-time radiance that it was hard to imagine the carnage that had taken place there 150 years ago.



Over a three day period in September of 1863 some 125,000 men struggled in the fields around Chickamauga Creek, and when it was over, some 35,000 were a casualty.

Saturday morning brought the rain which stayed with us off and on (mostly on) until Sunday afternoon late. We left in some light rain on Sunday morning, which increased as we got closer to Knoxville. I was very proud of Chapter B riders as everyone was riding in the group with increased interval at a slower speed, and no one got in a hurry when our group got split up by interstate traffic from time to time. Easy does it was the motto of the day. Now, I know that some in our group were a little nervous when we left Chattanooga in the rain, but they all rode like the veterans they were becoming. Riding in the rain takes confidence in both yourself and your motorcycle; and the only way to get that confidence is to ride in the rain--you can't just talk about it-you have to do it.

About 14 years ago, I started guiding ATV rides. I had organized rides and often got left, with a group, who were all lost. I didn't like the feeling of being left and not knowing where I was or where I was going. So I learned the area, and treated people the way I wanted to be treated.

I also learned a lot by watching people and seeing how they reacted to different situations. My golden rule is "only ride as fast as your slowest rider". Over the years I have guided well over 250 ATV rides and about 50 motorcycle rides. The only reason I mention this, is that you never stop learning about roads, trails, and people.

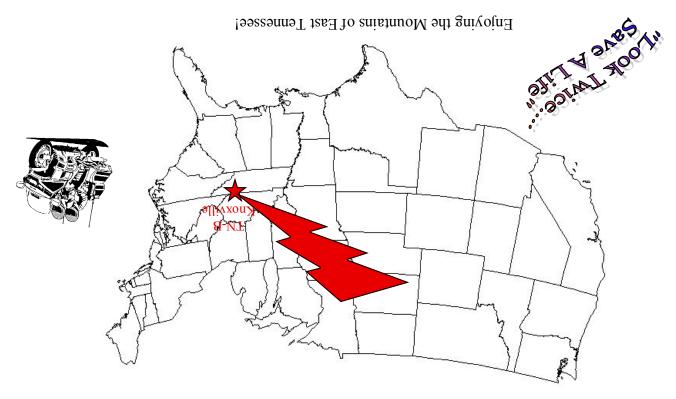
I learned over the years, pre-ride your routes or at least learn them from maps; you cannot rely on Sally (GPS) - our Branson, MO ride was a prime example.

To me half the fun is planning the routes, finding good and cheaper hotels, and figuring out things to do once you get "there".

The biggest problem for the ride leader is keeping bikes together at a safe interval; a lot times everyone will get spaced out at larger intervals. This makes it harder to keep up, and for the leader, trying not to lose them, especially in town driving. Thank goodness for CB radio's.
