With the roads being so short of everyday traffic due to the present situation, many of us are finding some better riding conditions when we get a nice day. But do not be fooled by the lack of traffic. Because of where some of us live we encounter daytime wildlife almost every day. Nor-mally I wouldn't even be talking about this subject until the fall, but I've noticed deer and other critters out on the backroads in daylight hours recently and I think it's due to the fact that the animals are noticing a tremendous reduction in roadway traffic that would normally keep them in the woods during the day.

Surelywe all can remember the occasional dog chasing your bike on a rural road, but I've had a time where five dogs on five different roads almost got me when I was the last of a three bike group all on the same day! I have also had a rather large buffalo that came within ten feet of my bike while touring Yellowstone National Park.

Here is a few suggestions:

1. Avoid riding at night whenever possible.

2. When vegetation is close to the pavement it is safer to ride in the middle of the lane. Animals often jump out of roadside brush onto the road.

3. When you see one deer, there likely will be more to follow. If you can stop safely, wait for all of them to pass.

4. Don't try to predict which way a deer in the road will flee. You do not know what they will do and neither do they! So just wait if possible.

5. Watch the road and terrain ahead for movement.

6. The yellow deer warning signs along the roadside are there for a reason. Pay attention and slow down. Deer and motorcycle collisions can be deadly to you as a rider. Much worse is running into an elk!

7. Deer whistles are not reliable.

8. Never get between an adult female animal and her young. It will not end well.

9. Always wear protective riding gear.

#### Bearings

Over the last few months I have been running into bearing issues on Goldwings. What the Service Department has run into on several occasions were MISADJUSTED. Steering head bearings have a special procedure to adjust them using a digital torque wrench so not to over tighten them. Here are some symptoms: if you feel roughness turning the handlebars bearings are failing and should be replaced. If you feel like the bike wants to steer tight or handlebars don't want to return to center. This is a normal sign of too much tension on the bearings. And lastly, if you get a steer head shake or also known as the death wobble, the bearings are set too loose. If the bearings have to be replaced there is a company called All Balls who produce a upgraded bearing that is tapered instead of ball bearing that improves the steering ability in a Goldwing

#### Spider owners

Can Am has been running into some body issues the first one is seat latch issues coming loose and mis-aligning striker, damaging seat bottom, you should check to make sure to properly align and lubricate with light oil or grease. The second one is the hinges on the front trunk bolts backing out or leaking water in the trunk; these should be checked and secured
