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



Friday October 5th we headed south to Florida for a couple weeks out on our Goldwing to enjoy some warmer weather and some of the fall colors.

We headed Down I-75 to Route 68 where we got off the Super Slab and onto the back roads. Some friends who stopped for an overnight at our place were staying in Georgia on vacation. Our route took us very near where they were staying so we met them for lunch there in the little town of Blue

enough excuse to take a ride. Always fun to see how other chapters operate. The one in Cocoa Beach was a smaller chapter and met in a BBQ place. The Daytona one was a huge chapter and previously held the Chapter of the Year award throughout GWRRA.





Riding around Daytona we were able to find some nice scenic roads and even had time to visit an old high school friend who lives in the area. Fun in the sun and the Ocean was perfect for swimming. A trip downtown

and a walk down Main Street was quite the experience to put it mildly. Later in the week we rode down to the light house and explored the old race course on the beach, that was used before to the International Speedway was built.

Very nostalgic for me since I watched the Daytona 200 mile race in 1957 while it was still on the beach— quite a change now from what I remember back then.




The Gerbings were coming in handy as the temps dropped to 37 and the rain was

Grandma's Graham Cracker Cookies

Line your cookie sheet with non stick aluminum foil. Line the cookie sheet with Graham Crackers. Combine and boil the following ingredients for 3 minutes 1/2 Cup Sugar 1/2 Cup Real Butter (No Substitute) 1/2 Cup Margarine

Pour hot syrup over Graham Crackers on the cookie sheet. Sprinkle with sliced Almonds (so they lay flat). Bake at 350 for 11 to 14 minutes.

As soon as you remove the pan from the oven, Cut into original Graham Cracker single rectangle size. When cooled, remove from pan and serve on a glass plate.

Peanut Butter Chewy

1/2 cup Peanut butter 1/2 Butter 1 1/2 cups Sugar 2 eggs 1 tablespoon vanilla 1 cup Flour (self rising)

Melt together the peanut butter and the butter in the microwave. Then add remaining ingredients.


Mix well, bake at 350 for 25 minutes in a 13 x 9 metal pan. Cool and cut.

Crabmeat Soufflé

- 1/4 c. flour1/4 t. salt1/8 t. white pepper3 T. margarine1 c. milk
- 3 egg yolks

1 c. cooked crabmeat, flaked

- 1 t. lemon juice
- 3 egg whites, stiffly beaten



Pumpkin Gooey Butter Cake

<u>Cake</u>:

1 box yellow cake mix 1 egg 1 stick of butter, melted <u>Filling</u>: 1 8oz package cream cheese, softened 1 15oz can of pumpkin (not pumpkin pie filling)

- 3 eggs 1 tsp vanilla 1 stick of butter melted
- 1 16oz box powdered sugar
- 1 tsp. cinnamon

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Combine the dry cake mix, egg & butter, and mix well with an electric mixer. It will be really stiff. Pat the mixture into the bottom of a lightly greased 13x9 inch baking pan. <u>To make the filling</u>: in a large bowl beat cream cheese and pumpkin with a mixer until smooth. Add the eggs, vanilla & butter; beat together. Next, add powdered sugar & cinnamon and mix well. Spread mixture over the cake batter and bake for 40 to 50 minutes. Don't overbake it so the filling is a little gooey. Serve with whipped cream (I use canned; you could use cool whip) if desired. **Joyce**









BEWARE OF OLD MOTORCYCLES

Someone once said that motorcycles are like people: when they get old, they require more maintenance. I guess I'm living proof of that statement, because I sure have required a LOT of maintenance lately.

Case in point: from the Knoxville News Sentinel, Oct. 7, 2012:

Knox county Mayor Tim Burchett is sporting a cast these days, the result of a motorcycle accident he had Thursday night.

A longtime motorcycling enthusiast, Burchett was riding his 1972 BSA-A65 Lightning around 9:30 p.m. on Amherst Road - a route he called "the Poor Man's Dragon" - when the back tire blew.

"I was trying to just get it off the road and lay it down on the side," he said, adding that a fence and some trees were coming up fast."

The result was Burchett on the ground with the bike on top of him. He said he "saw stars" but quickly realized the motorcycle engine was still running at top speed. With some struggle he was able to turn off the key. He noticed his wrist was wet and assumed he'd hit some water only to realize it was his own blood. "It kind of exploded," he said later.

He said Billy Wilson, a friend, drove up and the two were able to get the motorcycle off the mayor. Burchett said he refilled the tire and drove the motorcycle another mile before it went flat again and he had to call a friend with a trailer to load it up and take it away.

Burchett said his right wrist and left elbow were hurting but he decided to go to work Friday and put in almost a full day until he finally went to see Dr. James Hurst, who diagnosed a broken wrist and sent him to Dr. Robert Ivy.

The wrist was put in a cast, which the mayor says he'll be wearing at least two weeks. "I don't know how I'll sign all of those honorary proclamations," he said. The left elbow was apparently not broken but the mayor, who said it actually hurts more, was advised to "take it easy for a while."

The accident was the latest in a bad run for the mayor.

"I had the flu the week before, I got divorced right in the middle of everything, then this." he said. "They say bad luck runs in threes, so I ought to go out and buy a lottery ticket today."

I don't want to "pile on" the mayor's misfortune, but I think we can learn some lessons from this incident.

 The older the motorcycle, the more thorough the pre-ride inspection. Gold Wings are incredible machines, but if you're riding an older one, pay closer attention to things. Make sure your motorcycle is "up to speed" before you throw a leg over -- particularly if you haven't been on it for a while.
 Riding at night on a curvy road increases your risk. (I won't comment on a BSA with a Lucus electrical system, but they didn't call Lucus the "Prince of Darkness" for nothing.) Slow down at night.

3) Know how to use your kill switch. The MSF recommends that you stop your Gold Wing's engine with the kill switch each time, before you turn your key off. This will make using the kill switch second nature.

4) Make sure you can concentrate on riding and not on other things that are going on in your life. Riding can be therapeutic and can help you refresh your mind,-- but-- be careful. If you can't focus on riding and you find yourself thinking about other things STOP. Rest awhile and refocus.

Remember, your mind is the most important piece of safety equipment you will ever own. You can get a new Gold Wing-- but there is only one you, so take care of yourself.



CREAM CHEESE BITS from Debbie Rhoads Grease miniature muffin tins with margarine. Sprinkle graham cracker crumbs into tins and shake out excess.

- MIX: (2) 8oz. packages of cream cheese ³/₄ cup sugar
 - 3 egg yolks

Fold in beaten egg whites. Drop mixture in tins -2/3 cup full.

Bake @350 degrees for approx. 15 min. Let cool, as they cool they will drop in the middle. **FILLING:** Mix ½ pint sour cream, 1 tsp. vanilla and 2 TBS. sugar. Drop in center of muffins. Sprinkle graham cracker crumbs over muffins. **Note:** These freeze very well. I flash freeze them first before putting in container. This recipe makes approx. 48 muffins.

We still have a few dates open, especially during July and August and we're open to impromptu rides as well.


