The Biker Wave

In the summer of 1991, I purchased my first street motorcycle in the U.S. It was a 1980 Suzuki GS-1000 and it was a great bike and Hedie and I would ride all around the East Texas oil roads on that bike. One thing I noticed almost immediately was that when I met other motorcyclists on the highway they would almost always give me a small wave or drop their left hand off their handlebar and point to the ground. Sometimes that movement would be accompanied by a nod. At first I was surprised by this acknowledgment (pleasantly I may add) as I never rode a street motorcycle in Canada (left for college when I was 19 years old and only rode dirt bikes growing up). This gesture between bikers has been called many things. The 'Motorcycle Wave', the 'Biker Wave' or the 'Motorcyclist Salute'. There are more than a few theories floating around as to its origin. Here are just a couple. **World War Two Veterans** - Some believe that one form of the wave came from the unique group of veterans that rode motorcycles after the end of WW2. Many of these men were dealing with PTSD and had a hard time readjust-

rode motorcycles after the end of WW2. Many of these men were dealing with PTSD and had a hard time readjusting to civilian life and there was a real brotherhood that came out of it. It is said that they used the wave style with the index and middle finger stuck out in a V-shape on the left hand with the palm-down as a sign of their shared military service and the solidarity that brought.

Mr. Harley and Mr. Davidson - Some believe it came from two great motorcycle icons when Arthur Davidson and William Harley passed each other when they were riding their motorcy-

cles. This theory is of course encouraged by the die-hard Harley-Davison riders. I don't blame them for claiming it but there is no proof that was the case.

In the end, it doesn't really matter who started it. What is important is what it means. The best name I've heard given to this wave is 'The Biker Benediction'. By pointing to the ground when greeting a fellow biker you are saying to them, 'May you keep your rubber on the ground and arrive safely home.' My friends, we are a unique group of people. We brave the weather, the wind, the road conditions and all the dangers that come along with it all for the joy of riding. I know personally that



whether it is a 22-year-old on a Kawasaki Ninja or a 50-year-old, unshaven, leather wearing, long bearded guy on a Harley-Davidson, when we meet each other on the open highway we have an instant connection. They may choose a different brand or style of motorcycle but in the end, we are connected by our love for two wheels (and three for some).

So, the next time you wave at someone, think of the Biker Benediction and maybe even say a short prayer for that person on the other bike. We are part of a unique group of people and we should celebrate and honor that kinship when we meet.







route had us starting out at the 141 exit in
