



Butler's Patent Velocycle

The very first commercial design for a self-propelled <u>bicycle</u> was a three-wheel design called the *Butler Petrol Cycle*, conceived of and built by <u>Edward Butler</u> in <u>England</u> in 1884. He exhibited his plans for the vehicle at the <u>Stanley Cycle Show</u> in London in 1884, two years earlier than <u>Karl Benz</u>, who is generally recognized as the inventor of the modern automobile. Butler's vehicle was also the first design to be shown at the 1885 <u>International Inventions Exhibition</u> in London.


The vehicle was built by the Merryweather Fire Engine company in Greenwich, in 1888.

[6] the Butler Petrol Cycle (first recorded use of the term) It was a three-wheeled vehicle, with the rear wheel directly driven by a 5/8hp (466W) 600 cc (40 in³; 2½×5-inch {57×127-mm}) flat twin four stroke engine (with magneto ignition replaced by coil and battery), equipped with rotary valves and a float-fed carburettor (five years before Maybach), and Ackermann steering, Il all of which were state of the art at the time. Starting was by compressed air. The engine was liquid-cooled, with a radiator over the rear driving wheel. Speed was controlled by means of a throttle valve lever. No braking system was fitted; the vehicle was stopped by raising and lowering the rear driving wheel using a foot-operated lever; the weight of the machine was then borne by two small castor wheels. The driver was

seated between the front wheels. [6] It wasn't, however, a commercial success, as Butler failed to find sufficient

financial backing.

Bike To Trike Part 3 – The Little Things You Should Know

This is the last of three articles I'm writing on making the transition from two to three wheels. In the first two articles I focused on what to consider when thinking about making a change to a trike and the second article was about how a trike rides and handles differently than a motorcycle. In this final article I want to touch on some of the little things you should know that will make your bike to trike experience a bit smoother.

Say Goodbye to the Slow-Motion Falls

One of the most common sentiments I have read from people that have switched to trikes is the increased stability and ease of handling in slow speed maneuvers. You won't have to worry about keeping your balance when coming to a stop at a light or when navigating around gas pumps. In fact, I will admit that riding a motorcycle with trike riders can be a bit challenging at times. Especially when entering gas stations or tight parking lots coming off a street or a highway. In those situations, a trike can dawdle along and turn this way and that at a crawl whereas that is more difficult to do when on a motorcycle. You guys just don't have to worry about balance or stopping on a hill or an sloped surface anymore.

Trikes Have a Big Butt!

Dave Roberts and I were talking while on the Americade trip and he said that one of the biggest things he had to get used to was the size of his trikes 'back end'. After years of riding a motorcycle and navigating it around he had to now get used to the fact his trike had a wide stance in the back that he had to consider. This is easy to forget too because what you are looking at through the front windshield is basically the same thing you always looked at when you rode your motorcycle. The GL1800 California Side Car and Hannigan trike conversions for the 2001-1012 model Goldwings are over 61" wide! Pulling up to gas pumps, going through toll booths, making turns with tall curbs all have to be done with the understanding you now have a big butt!

Let it Blow...Let it Rain!

Trikes are much more stable on the highway when going around large vehicles such as tractor trailers and big gusts of wind won't toss you around like they do a motorcycle. Additionally, you will have more protection from rain on your legs because of design of the fairings.

Let Em' Squirm!

If you have ever given an 'inexperienced' rider a ride on your motorcycle you know you have to do some coaching or you are going to have some challenge. Bill tells a great story about the first ride he gave Barbara on his motorcycle! Riding with a passenger on a Trike does not carry the same challenges. Passenger leaning or squirming around on a Trike is not as serious a problem because of the stability you have with the three wheels. Let them squirm all they want; you won't feel it much at all.

Pack it and Forget it.

You want storage? You got storage out the proverbial ying-yang! Trikes have great storage capacity and of course pull trailers without much thought. You have plenty of room for all the stuff your wife wants to bring with her. Well, that's it! I hope this series of articles on trikes helped some of you that may be interested in eventually moving from a bike to a trike. Thanks to those that answered my questions and who knows...maybe someday I may show up to our meeting with a yellow trike. I'll just explain that Elly May gained some weight in her backside!
