Happy Trails



Get a Load of This!

We have all seen them. The two guys in a car driving down the road each one of them with an arm out the window 'holding down' a mattress laying on the roof of their car. If you are like me, you probably laughed and said something like: "Are those guys crazy?" or "That won't turn out well". There are many mattresses along the sides of the highway that attest to the fact we are right. All along the over 4 million miles of highway in our nation you will find people transporting items in the back of trucks or on open trailers (or car roofs) that are not secured correctly and end up flying off into the roadway. It's like they are trying to live out the first sentence of the famous Eagles song 'Take It Easy' (sing it to yourself...it will make sense). These poorly secured loads pose a very serious potential hazard for motorcycle and trike riders.

I recently watched a video of a younger motorcycle rider on a smaller sport bike following an SUV pulling a boat. They were going about 50 mph. On the back stoop of the boat was some type of large rolled up foam float pad that was about 2 feet in diameter. As the rider follows the boat the pad suddenly comes loose and falls off the back of the boat. The rider tries to avoid it but ends up riding into and onto the rolled-up pad, his bike jumps in the air and ejects him. He does a good 15 barrel rolls on the asphalt as his motorcycle slides off onto the shoulder of the road and all the vehicles behind frantically swerve to avoid them both. Fortunately, the young rider only had minor injuries (a lot of road rash as he was wearing shorts) and I'm sure his bike was not near as pretty as it was before. The reality is this accident could have been avoided. In this article I want to share some tips on how to avoid situations such as these.

Be Aware of Vehicles Pulling or Carrying Loads – As a motorcycle or trike rider all of us know we don't have the luxury of not paying attention to everything around us. We do tend to focus on hazards on the road surface because they, of course, contain the most common hazards to riders. However poorly secured loads, although not as much of a threat, still pose a significant potential hazard. Every rider should always be looking for vehicles carrying or pulling loads.

Try To Avoid Following People Pulling Loads – The easiest solution is to just not follow behind people carrying or pulling loads. When I use the term 'loads' I'm referring to scenarios such as a truck with multiple items in the bed or a vehicle pulling an open trailer carrying items that would be difficult to secure. The most common culprits are people helping a friend move to a new residence on the other side of town. They often have a truck or trailer filled with a bunch of poorly boxed or totally unboxed household items that are difficult to secure and often not secured at all. Another common culprit is someone hauling tree and yard debris. I'm sure there are many more scenarios many of you veteran riders could name. Many of the people transporting these loads have little to no comprehension of the impact the wind creating by driving down the road at 55 or 65 mph can have on the load they have behind them. They also have no idea how to correctly use ropes or ratchet straps (as is evidenced by the number of ratchet straps littered the sides of our highways). Couch cushions, kitchen chairs, bags of clothes, branches, bags of leaves, are just some of the things that can fly off and land in front of us. The best thing to do is just avoid following behind them.

Leave Room to React – If you cannot avoid following someone pulling a load then simply follow far enough behind to allow yourself time the to respond if something falls off the load in front of you. The young rider I mentioned at the beginning of this article was following less than one second behind the driver of the SUV pulling the boat. If he had been following further back, he could have easily avoided the large foam float when it fell off the back of the boat.

In summary be aware of those loading carrying or pulling vehicles and do our part to avoid following behind them at all costs. Ride safe my friends but ride on!

Handlebars they house our controls and control the bike as we ride but when manufactures build the bike they are set to one position and sometimes they don't feel right to some riders but the solution is to put a riser kit on the handlebars they raise them about a ¾ inch and move them back about 1½ of a inch so you don't have to reach as far to grasp the grips and changes the way you feel the bike as you ride it has been shown to relief shoulder pain on long rides according to people I have installed them for.



This is a handlebar riser kit. These risers are made by MBL Innovations and is designed to move the handlebars to a more comfortable position. Gold Wings have long been considered the pinnacle of comfort as far as motorcycles go, but many riders find that the handlebar positioning requires too much of a reach to allow them to ride for long stretches without causing discomfort. This kit consists of shims and hardware to change the positioning of your stock handlebars. Two versions are available - both bring the bars up 3/4" and back 1 1/2" toward you. Most riders also find that the span is too wide, so the standard kit (S) also narrows the span of the grips by 2-1/4". Tall riders with long arms may be comfortable with the span, so the wide kit (W) just moves the bars up and back without narrowing the span. These subtle changes can make a long ride much more comfortable, and reduce stresses on the wrists and back. This kit will fit all Goldwing GL1800's and F6B's from 2001-2017.




Picket State Park and Sterns Ky




